
# Washington County Family and Children First Council Shared Plan for SFY 2023-2025

2. Identify alternative needs assessment methods or data sets that were utilized to identify the Shared Priorities:

Washington County Family & Children First held a Council Retreat on June 15<sup>th</sup> with 26 Council members and staff in attendance. At the retreat, members broke into groups and completed the following:

**Review of Community Survey Results and CHA** – Results for the 2022 Community Values Survey and excerpt from 2021 Community Health Assessment were reviewed.

**Review Shared Plan Process/Guidance** – The Family and Children First Council HB289 Shared Plan Guidance was reviewed. **Survey Roundtables – Worksheet #1** – Defining Shared Priorities worksheet. Each group was directed to identify at least one "Need/Potential Shared Priority" based on the data.

**Groups Report Out** – Groups reported out on their list of Needs/Potential Shared Priorities.

**Worksheet #2: Ranking Shared Priorities** – Groups rated the 9 shared priorities identified. Scores were compiled and written on flip charts.

**Prioritizing with Dots** – After group scores were compiled and identified on the flip charts, members were given two dots to vote for their top two individual priorities. These total dots were added to the group scores to give a final score. Discussion followed.

**Worksheet 3a: Current Community Efforts** – The top 3 priorities identified after scoring were now listed on the Current Community Efforts worksheet for groups to identify the current efforts around these priorities.

**Worksheet 3b:** New Activities – The top 3 priorities identified after scoring were now listed on the new activities worksheet and groups identified new activities.

Members were then asked, by a show of hands, which priority(ies) should be included in our Shared Plan as a Top Priority. The following results were identified.

**3** - Life Skills: For Parents and Youth

**8** - Mental Health: Access to Services

 ${\bf 10}$  - Community Resources: Access and Awareness

Following the Retreat, a Shared Plan Workgroup was formed from Council and staff members. At the first meeting of the Workgroup, the team decided to address just one priority at this time for our Shared Plan and chose "Community Access: Resources and Awareness". A second meeting of the Workgroup was held to develop a draft Shared Plan to present to Council.

### 3. Identify any barriers experienced in this process (i.e. plan collection, availability of data, language issues, etc.):

A barrier to completing this process is the requirement of including 'enhanced service coordination'. It is extremely challenging to attempt to plan for FCF service coordination at this time with the unknowns surrounding the implementation of OhioRISE and its full effect on our system of care.

### 4. Identify any successes/how this process has worked to strengthen the council and county collaboration:

Council members and staff were actively engaged in the retreat process. The collaboration between Council members and staff was positive and noted on the post retreat surveys. Having staff, as front-line workers, was a plus in the process, as they communicated and interacted with Council members and brought different perspectives. We feel there was a definite strengthening and engagement of the Council through this collaborative effort to identify priorities for our county.
